At Indian Hills Animal Clinics we understand that every pet is unique. Factors, such as age, breed and what your cat is exposed to, carry certain risks and health needs. This brochure is intended to give you an overview of our recommendations. However, based on your cat's individual needs and risks, our doctors will determine what is needed for your pet's optimum health.

Fleas

Fleas are a very common problem in cats that spend any time outdoors or live with a dog or another cat that spends time outdoors. Fleas also act as vectors (carriers) of tapeworms, an intestinal parasite. Flea control is best achieved by having a thorough understanding of the flea life cycle and formulating a plan to disrupt it. Flea control and prevention must address both the environment (house and yard), where the egg, larvae, and pupa live, and all the pets in the household, where the adult fleas are. *See our Flea brochure for more information.*

Heartworms

Heartworm disease is a serious and often fatal disease in cats. While it has traditionally been thought of as a "dog only" problem, heartworms are being diagnosed with increasing frequency in cats. Heartworm disease is very preventable.

Revolution

Revolution is the first-ever FDA-approved, topically applied medication for cats that:

- Kills adult fleas (*Ctenocephalides felis*) and prevents flea eggs from hatching.
- Prevents heartworm disease caused by *Dirofilaria immitis*.
- Treats and controls ear mites (*Otodectes cynotis*).
- Treats and controls roundworms (*Toxocara cati*) and hookworms (*Ancylostoma tubaeforme*).

Physical Exam: A complete examination evaluating all organ systems. You receive a comprehensive report identifying and explaining our findings and recommendations. In cats over 7 years of age twice-a-year physical examinations is necessary for early disease detection.	\$48.00	\$48.00	\$48.00
Feline Leukemia (FeLV) / FIV (Feline AIDS) Test: These two deadly diseases can be transmitted by other cats and from the mother, via the uterus and nursing. We highly recommend all cats and kittens be tested negative for these diseases prior to starting vaccines.	\$50.00	\$50.00	
Feline Leukemia (FeLV) Vaccine: A fatal and highly contagious viral disease. Recommended for cats that spend any time outside and/or live with other cats who spend time outside. This vaccine is always done in conjunction with a Physical Exam.	\$25.50	\$25.50	
Rabies Vaccine: A fatal and highly contagious viral disease. Rabies is a risk to you and your family. We offer two types of rabies vaccines for cats– a 1 year non-adjuvant vaccine or a 3 year adjuvant. Our doctors will discuss which is best for your cat.	\$20.75	\$20.75	
FVRCP (Distemper Vaccine): This vaccine protects from a variety of viral upper respiratory diseases that are contagious. Recommended for all cats. This vaccine is always done in conjunction with a Physical Exam. Only needed once every three years in previously vaccinated adult cats over 2 years.	\$17.50	\$17.50	
Spay or Neuter: If your cat is not spayed or neutered we highly recommend doing so to avoid unwanted kittens and to avoid health risks like Pyometra (a life threatening disease in females), breast cancer, testicular cancer, and prostate disease.	yes	yes	yes
Fecal Exam: This examination consists of two tests that check for 7 different intestinal parasites. Cats are checked twice during their first year. Some of these parasites can be a risk to you and your family.	\$21.00	\$21.00	yes
Heartworm / Flea Preventative to protect your cat from heartworms and fleas. Incidence of heartworms is not correlated to the amount of time your cat spends outside. Diagnostic Screening: Depending upon the age, physical exam and medical history, we recommend annual blood testing to assess major organ function. This serves to detect diseases early as well as giving us a baseline of normal values for your cat. These tests look for anemia, diabetes, kidney and liver problems. In cats over 7 years of age a thyroid level is also checked.	yes		yes
