At Indian Hills Animal Clinic, we understand that every pet is unique. Factors, such as age, breed, and type of environment your puppy is exposed to, carry with them certain risks and health needs. This brochure is intended to give you an overview of our recommendations. However, based on your puppy's individual needs and risks, our doctors will determine what is needed for your pet's optimum health.

Fleas



Fleas are a very common problem in dogs that spend any time outdoors or live with another dog or cat that spends time outdoors. Fleas also act as vectors (carriers) of tapeworms, an intestinal parasite. Flea control is best achieved by having a thorough understanding of the flea life cycle and formulating a plan to disrupt it. Flea control and prevention must address both the environment (house and yard), where the egg, larvae, and pupa live, and all the pets in the household, where the adult fleas are. *See our Flea brochure for more information.*

Heartworms

Heartworm disease is a serious and potentially fatal disease seen in dogs. Dogs acquire heartworms through the bite of an infected mosquito. Heartworm disease is a very preventable disease. See our Heartworm Disease brochure for more information.

Sentinel

There are five key parasites that pose a threat to your dog's health: fleas, heartworms, roundworms, hookworms (*A. caninum*) and whipworms. DHAPP (Distemper/Parvo Vaccine): This vaccine protects from a variety of viral diseases that are highly contagious and potentially life threatening. Recommended for all dogs. This vaccine is always done in conjunction with a Physical Exam.	\$17.00	\$17.00	\$17.00	
Bordetella (ITII or "Kennel Cough") Vaccine: This vaccine protects from an upper respiratory disease that produces coughing, sneezing, and sometimes nasal discharge. This airborne disease is most often transmitted at boarding facilities, grooming shops, and parks. Your puppy can also contract this disease in its own yard. Recommended for all dogs. This vaccine needs to be updated every 6 months.	\$16.50			
Fecal Exam: This examination consists of two tests that check for 7 different intestinal parasites. Puppies are checked twice during their first year. Some of these parasites can be a risk to you and your family.	\$21.00			\$21.00
Rabies Vaccine: A fatal and highly contagious viral disease. Required by law. Puppies are vaccinated for rabies once time and then boosted 1 year later. After that, they can receive a 3 year rabies vaccine. Rabies is a risk to you and your family.				\$17.25
Borrelia (Lymes) Vaccine: If your puppy is routinely exposed to ticks, then this vaccine is highly recommended. This disease can cause symptoms such as joint pain, fever, depression, and loss of appetite. This vaccine is always done in conjunction with a Physical Exam.		\$32.00	\$32.00

Diagnostic Screening: To minimize potential risk and provide you and us with peace of mind, we recommend pre-anesthetic blood testing prior to your pet being put under anesthesia. These tests look for anemia, diabetes, kidney and liver problems.				yes
Spay or Neuter: Having your puppy spayed or neutered not only helps with the world pet population, but it also protects your pet from many diseases in the future. We recommend having your puppy spayed or neutered at 6 months of age. This is the ideal time before they develop some of the less desirable traits of their sex. We also use this time to make sure all their adult teeth have erupted and all their baby teeth have fallen out.				yes

Leptospirosis Vaccine: Leptospirosis is a highly contagious parasite that leads to kidney & liver failure in dogs. Wichita and the surrounding area have become a "hot spot" for this disease.
